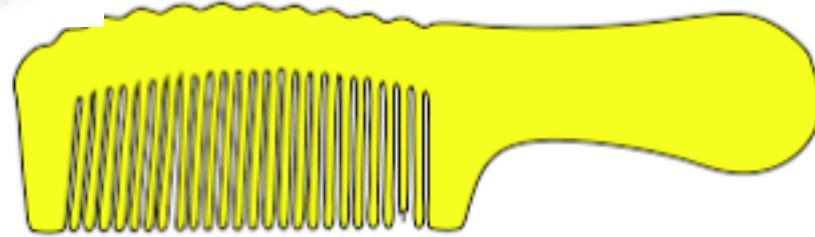

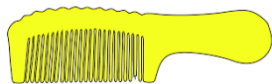

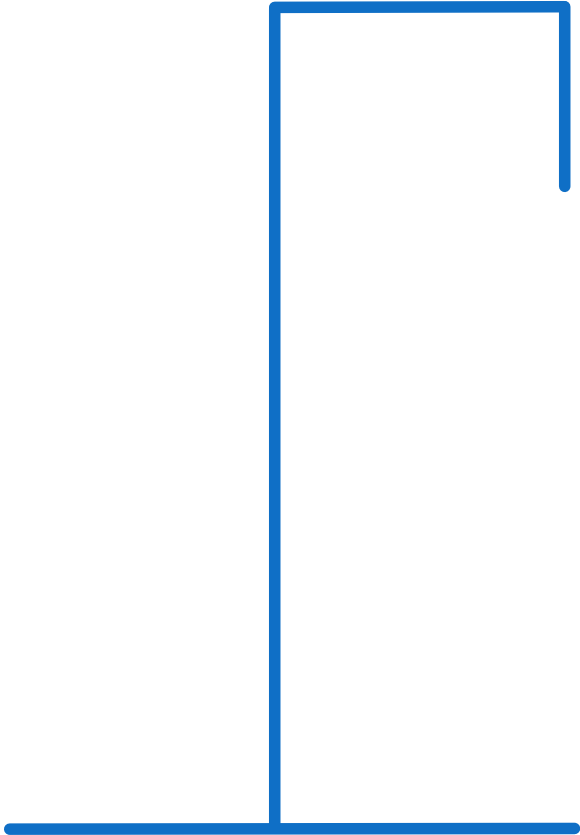

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use with countable nouns | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Use with uncountable nouns |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Things you can pick up and count | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Things that you can NOT count |
| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Usually ends with an -s | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Doesn't usually end with an -s |
| Example: apples, pictures, pencils, dog | Example: water, rice |

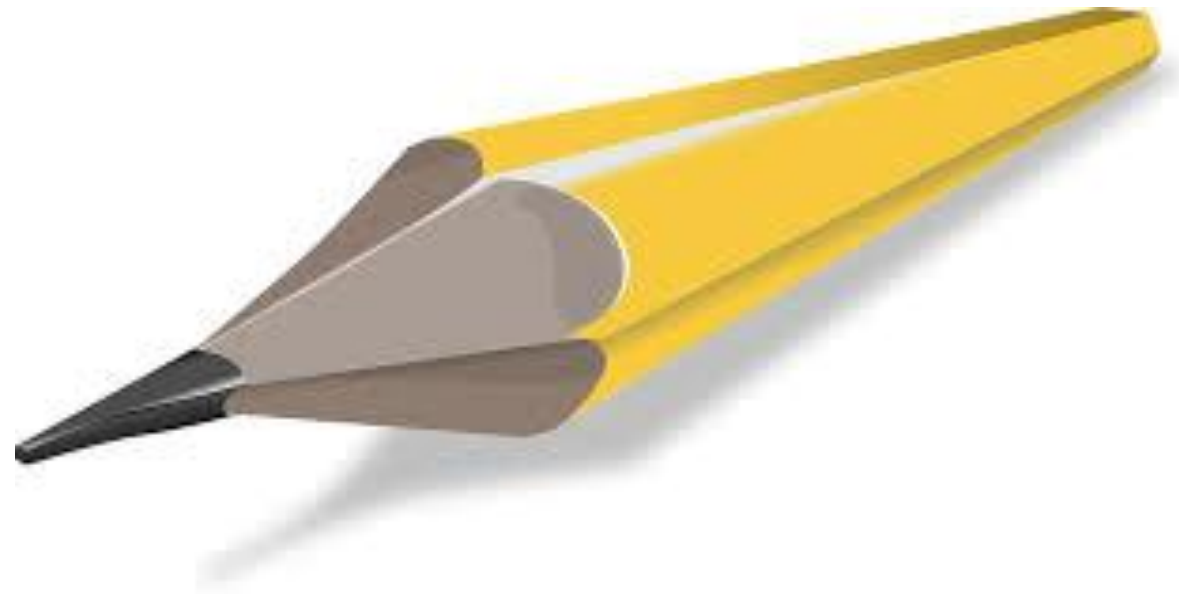
