Did not → Don't

To create a short form you drop the vowel sound and add an apostrophe.

There	There is	There's
That	That is	That's

Do not	Don't
Does not	Doesn't

Was not	Wasn't

Has not	Hasn't
Will not	Won't
Can not	Can't
Should not	Shouldn't
Could not	Couldn't



"Turtles come out of eggs," he said.


"Yes, they do," said Jack's mum.




