- 1.6 So the elderly people would decide to go to the park at dinnertime, (rush hour) rather than preparing or eating dinner like everyone else? Why wouldn't they go to the park at a time that makes more sense, like the morning or afternoon?
- 1.7 This seems to be a big IF which makes it difficult to be persuasive.
