In Minds On, you researched a South American city. Now, you will use that research for a writing assignment. This activity will provide an opportunity to write a series of paragraphs about the South American city you selected using the graphic organizer you completed.

Your assignment is to write a series of paragraphs about a South American city. Here are the specific instructions:

- Write about the same city you researched.
- Write 200-300 words.
- Use the information from your graphic organizer.
- Write a series of paragraphs with headings.
- Use the categories from your graphic organizer as headings in the writing.
- Use colour in your title and headings.
- Use boxes to show important statistics, quotations, etc.
- Use images.
- Include the sources used at the end of the report.

Toronto

Toronto is the capital city of the province of Ontario and the largest city in Canada by population, with 2,731,571 residents in 2016.

A global city, Toronto is a centre of business, finance, arts, and culture, and is recognized as one of the most multicultural and cosmopolitan cities in the world.

Indigenous peoples have travelled through and inhabited the Toronto area, situated on a broad sloping plateau interspersed with rivers, deep ravines, and urban forest, for more than 10,000 years. After the broadly disputed Toronto Purchase, when the Mississaugas surrendered

the area to the British Crown, the British established the town of York in 1793 and later designated it as the capital of Upper Canada. During the War of 1812, the town was the site of the Battle of York and suffered heavy damage by U.S. troops. York was renamed and incorporated as the city of Toronto in 1834, and became the capital of the province of Ontario during Canadian Confederation in 1867.
