- A common school-wide assessment and evaluation policy;
- A common procedure for reporting to parents;
- · A common school-wide attendance policy; and
- A central office for the maintenance of student records

- 30 total credits (18 compulsory, 12 optional)
- 40 hours of community involvement activities
- the provincial literacy requirement

A course credit is granted to students who receive a passing grade of 50% and above.
