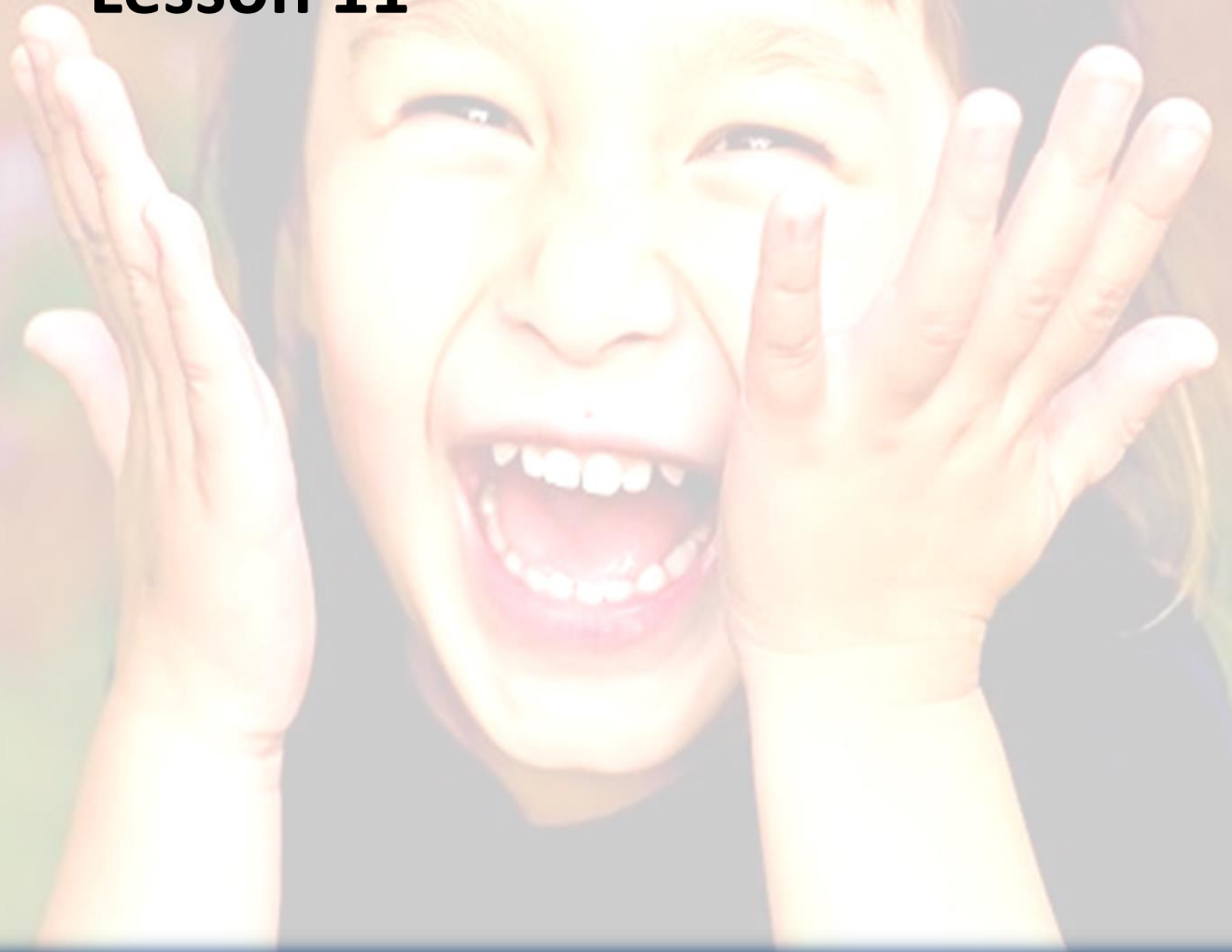

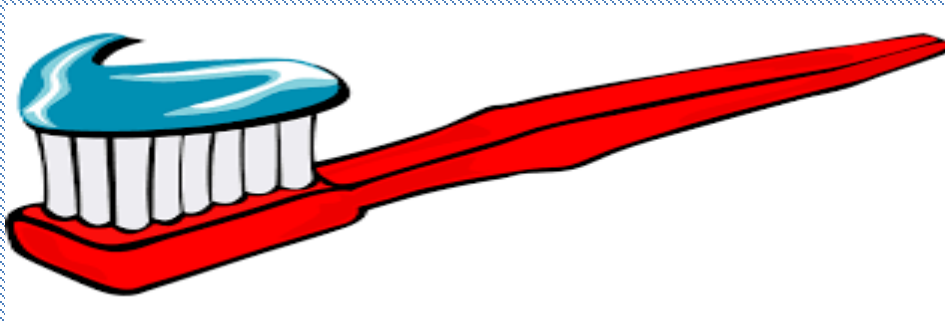
Keeping your teeth healthy

But now I have to brush one less!

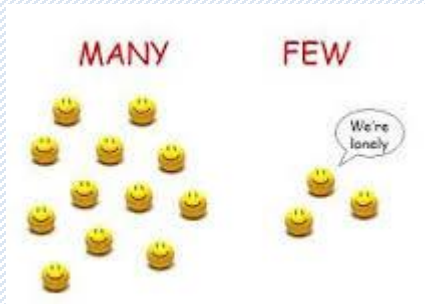

Couplet

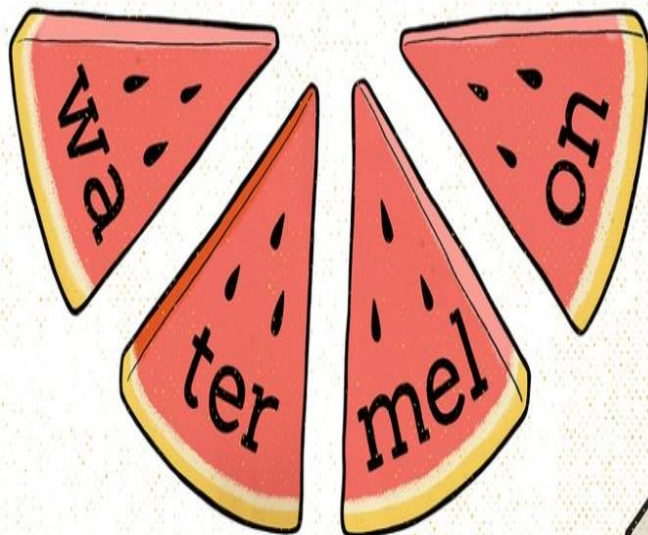
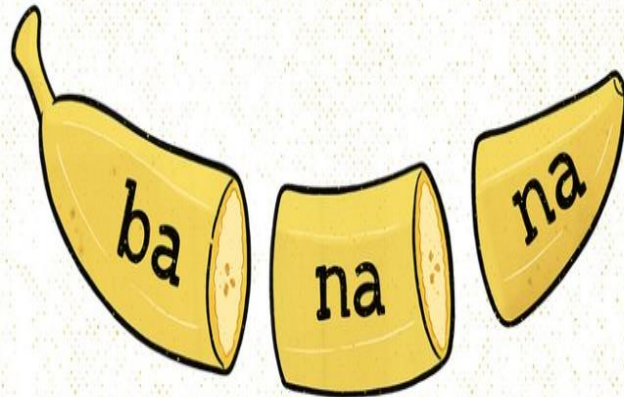
- A couplet is a poem, or stanza in a poem, written in two lines.
- Usually rhymes.



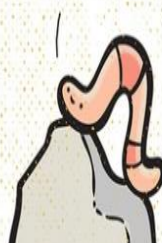

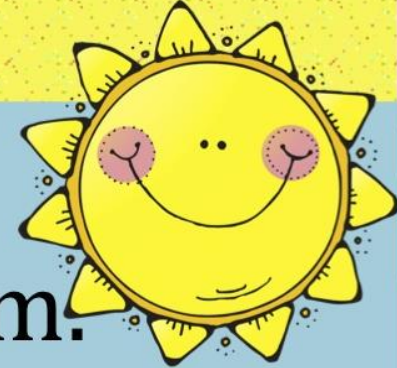
SYLLABLES

Sunshine fills the air.

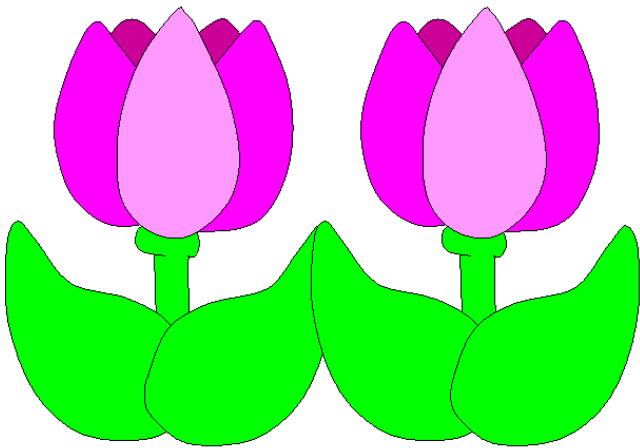

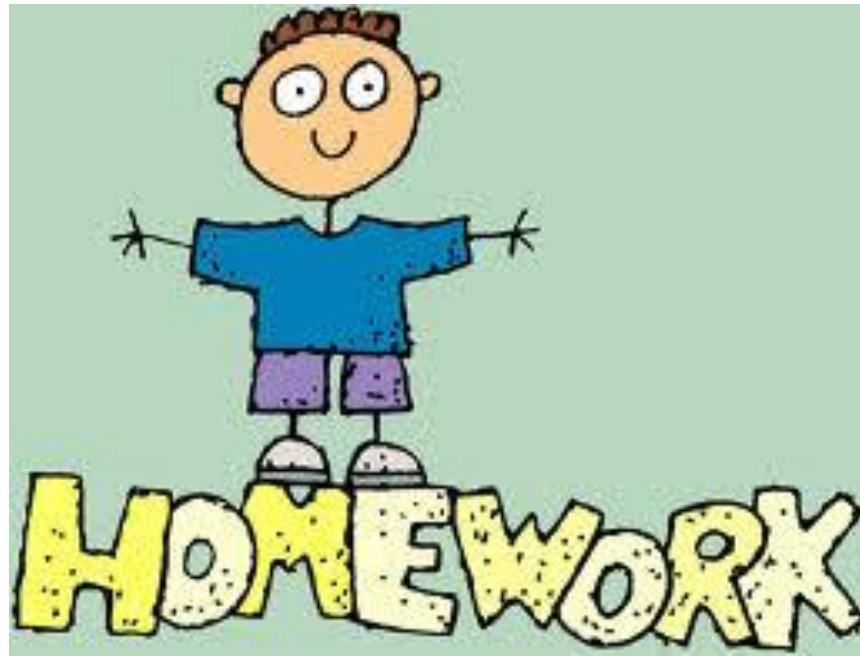
