

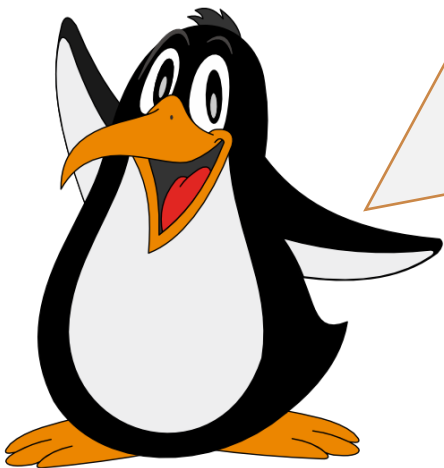

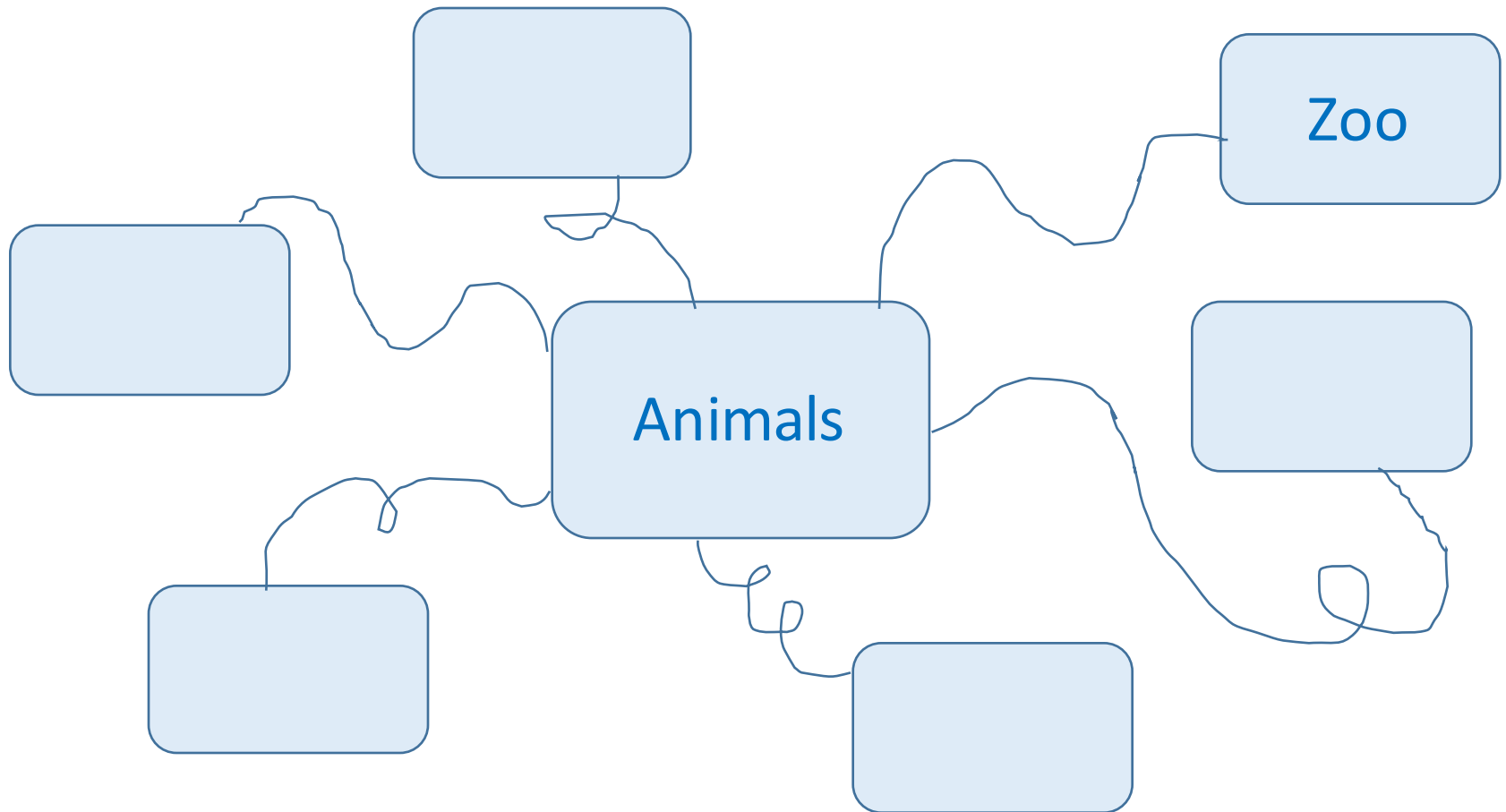

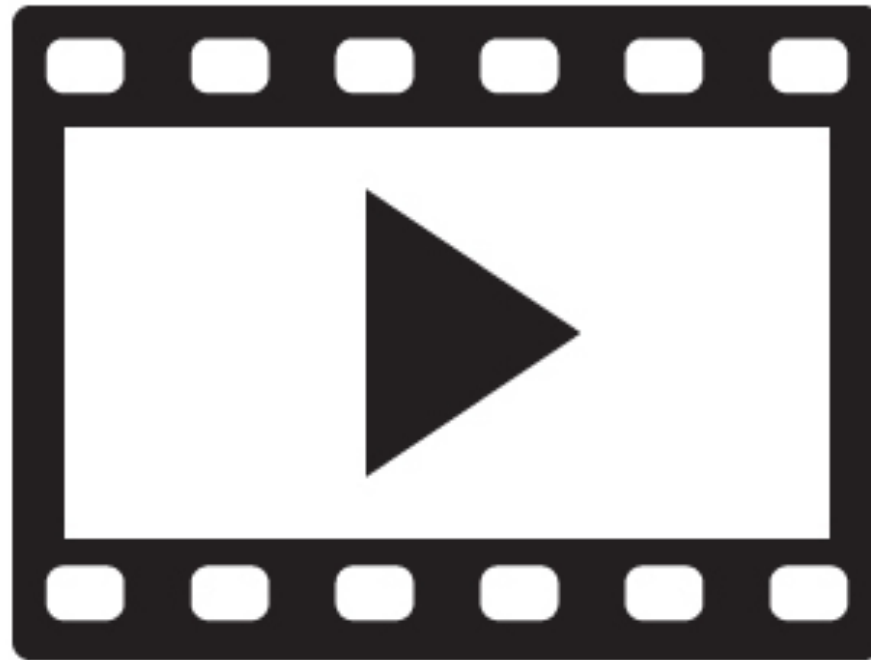

Having a pet is a big job! They need 4 things to live:

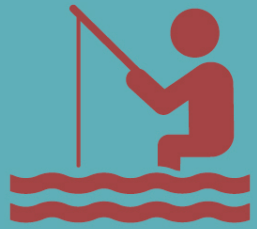
1. Food

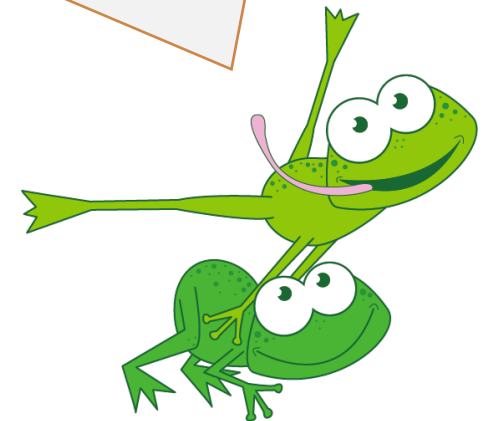

Alliteration is words in a row in a sentence or poem that begin with the same letter.

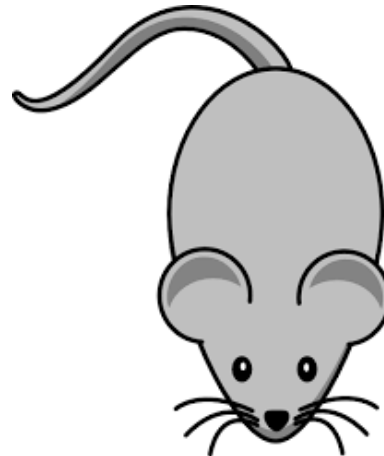
Example: Ally the ant ate apples.
