

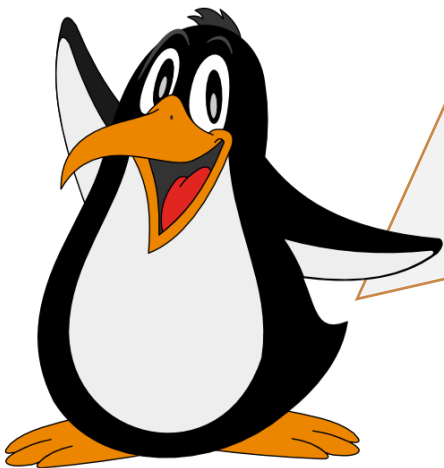

Types of boats: Motor Boat

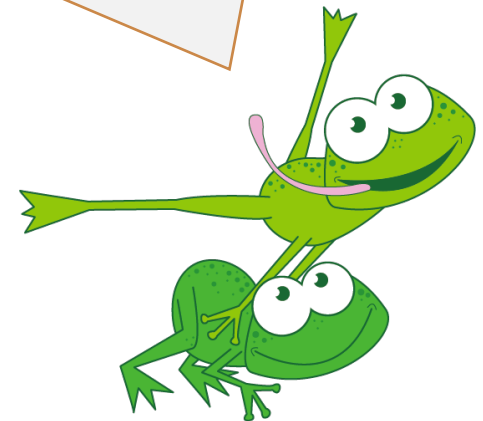


People go on motor boats for fun and to go fast! You can go fishing on this boat.

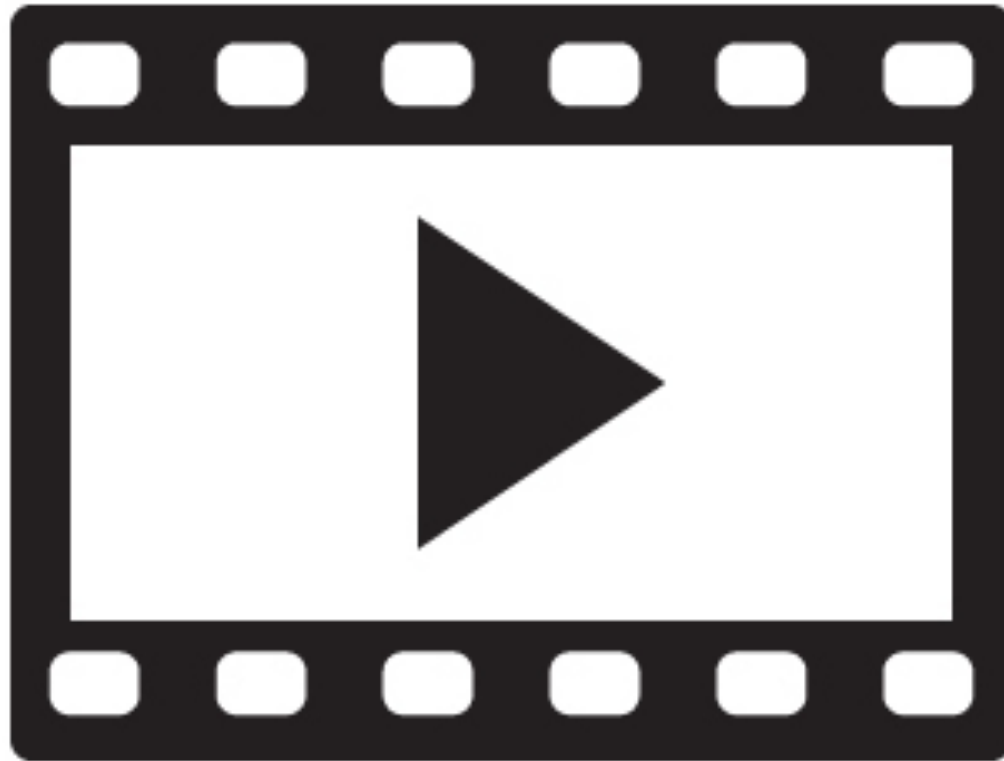
