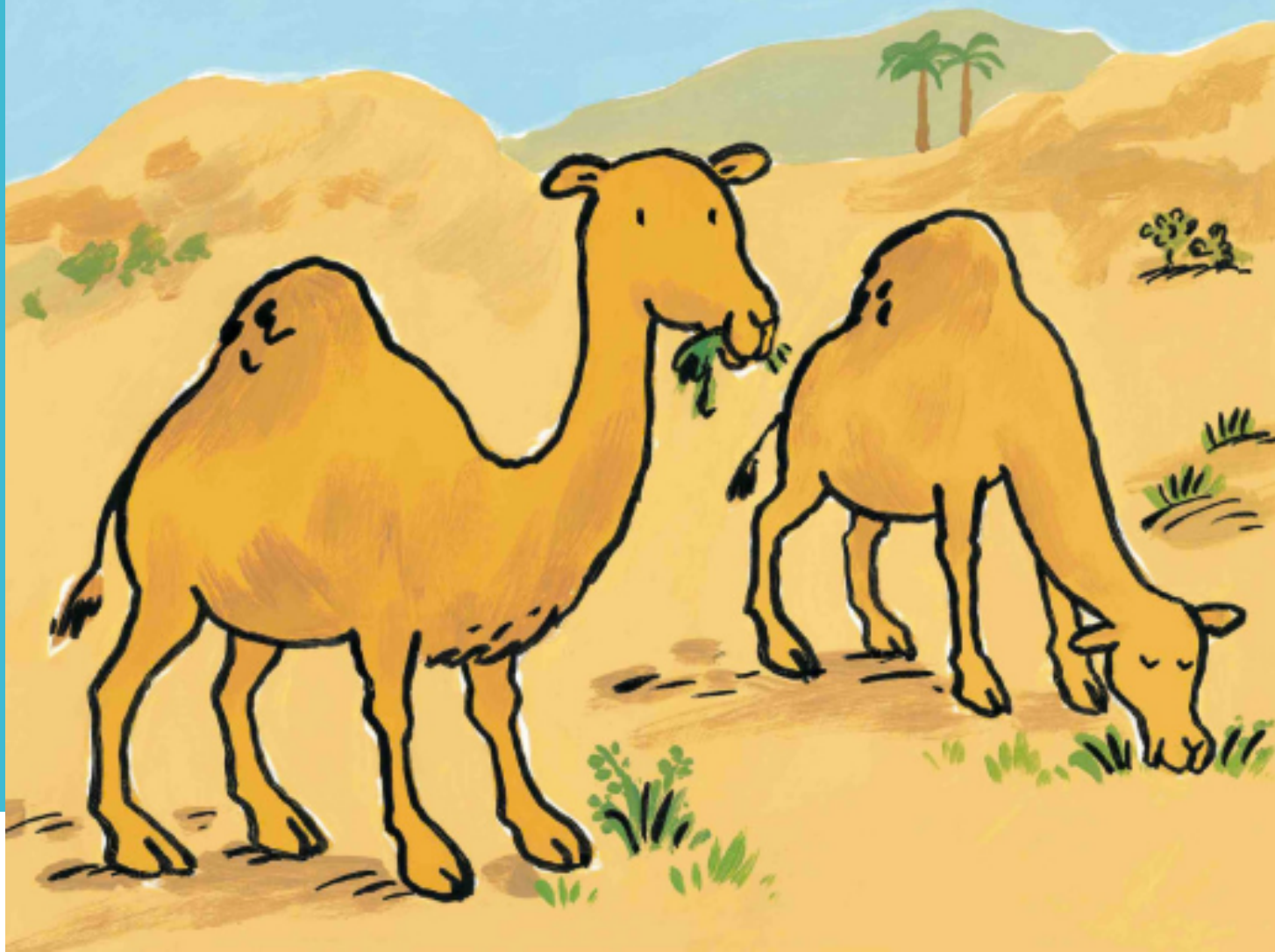
Does a camel cook?



No. A camel doesn't cook!

Camels eat grass and leaves.

They can go for a month without food.



Does a squirrel cook?





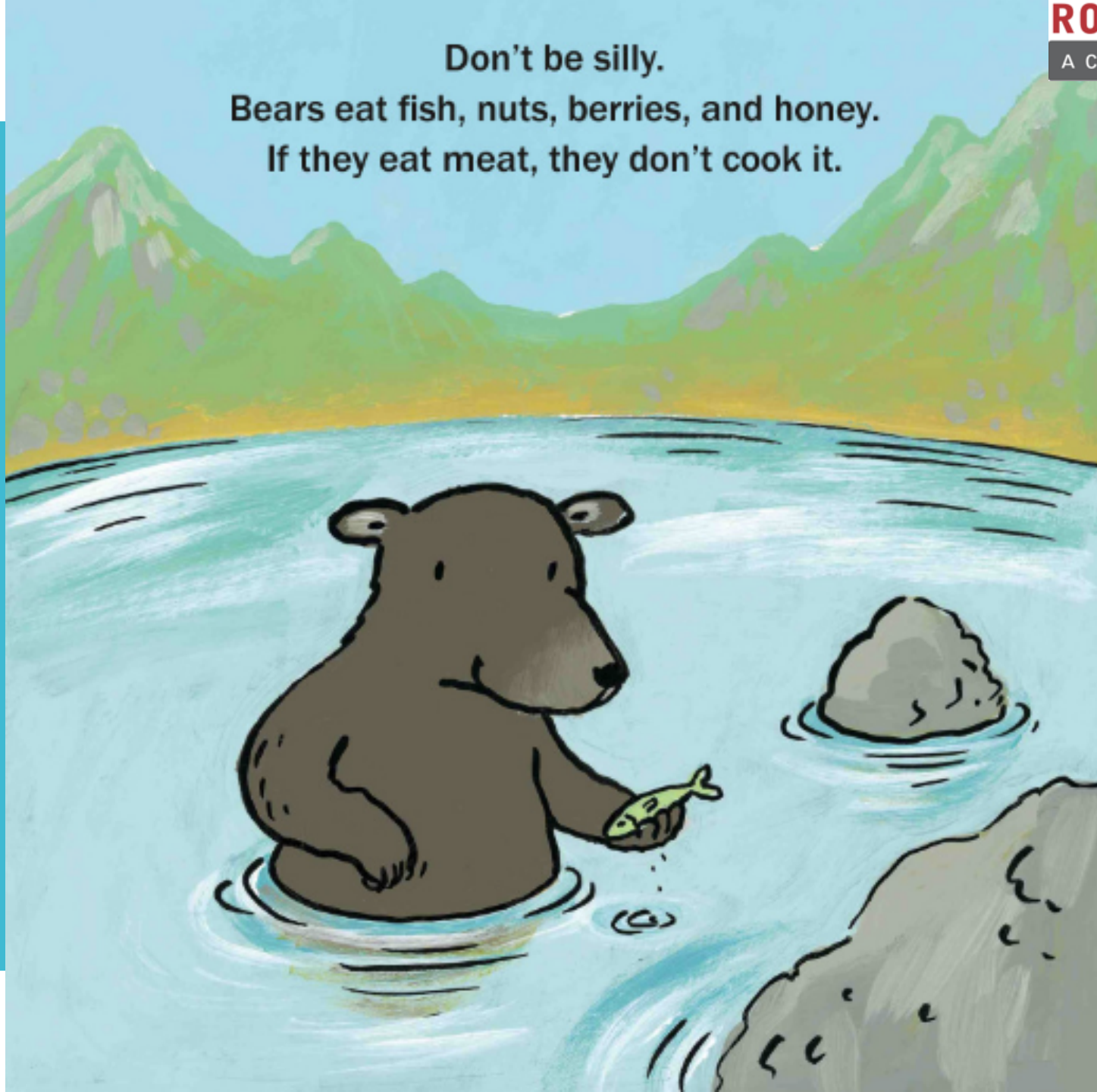
Of course not. A squirrel doesn't cook.

Squirrels gather nuts and seeds.
They eat some and store the rest for the winter.

Does a bear cook?



Don't be silly.
Bears eat fish, nuts, berries, and honey.
If they eat meat, they don't cook it.



Does a raccoon cook?



No way!
Raccoons eat just about
everything—fish, fruit, nuts,
and even garbage.



Raccoons wash their
food with water
before they eat it.
If they can't find
water, they “wash”
their food without it.





Does a chimp cook?

No, chimps don't cook.

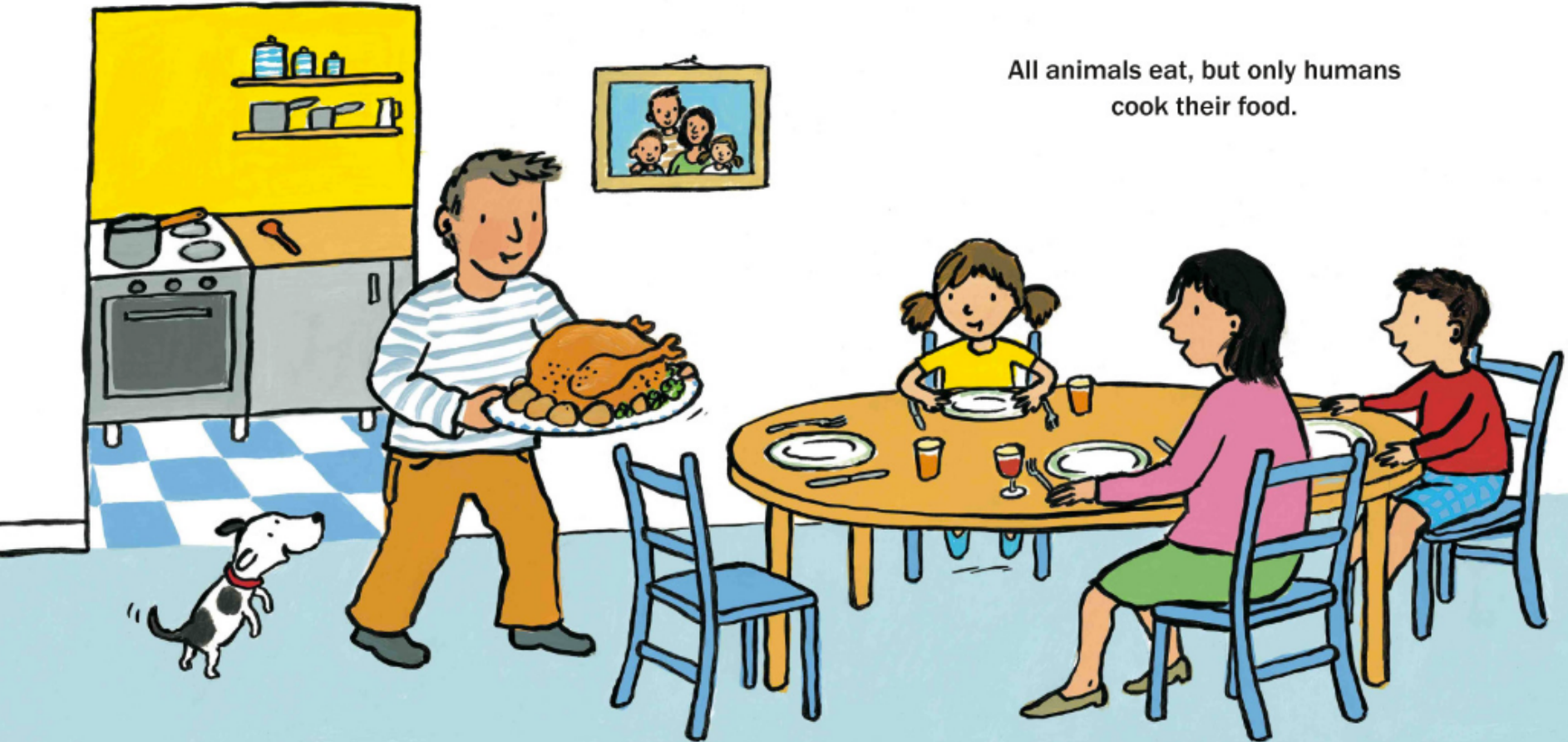
Unlike other animals, chimps can use tools to find food.

A chimp can use a piece of grass to fish termites
out of a hole in the ground.

But a chimp can't cook those termites!



All animals eat, but only humans
cook their food.



Humans grow fruits and vegetables
on farms or in gardens.



They raise animals for meat and milk.

Humans use many different tools
to help them prepare their food—knives, forks,
spoons, pots, pans, stoves, and ovens.



People in different countries prepare different kinds of foods.



In Italy, they prepare a lot of pasta, such as spaghetti or ravioli.



In Japan, they make sushi, which is raw fish and rice wrapped in seaweed.



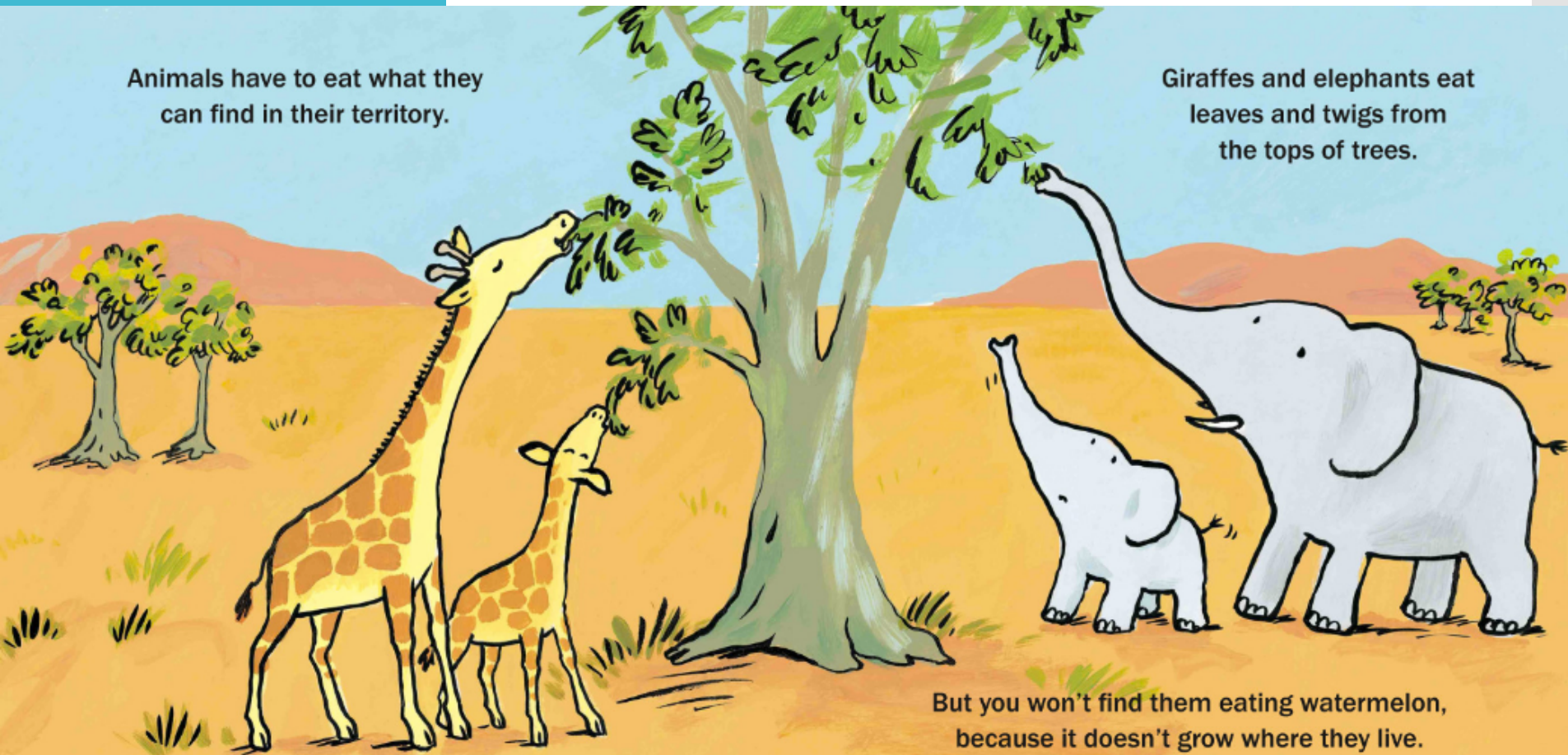
In India, they cook curry using vegetables and spices.

In America, many people like to eat
hot dogs and hamburgers and french fries.



Animals have to eat what they
can find in their territory.

Giraffes and elephants eat
leaves and twigs from
the tops of trees.



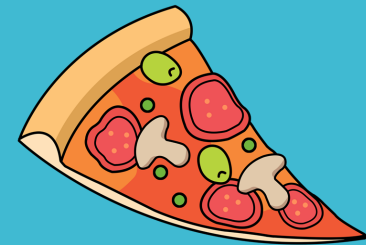
