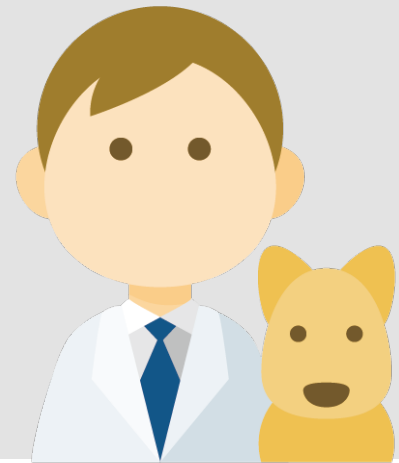

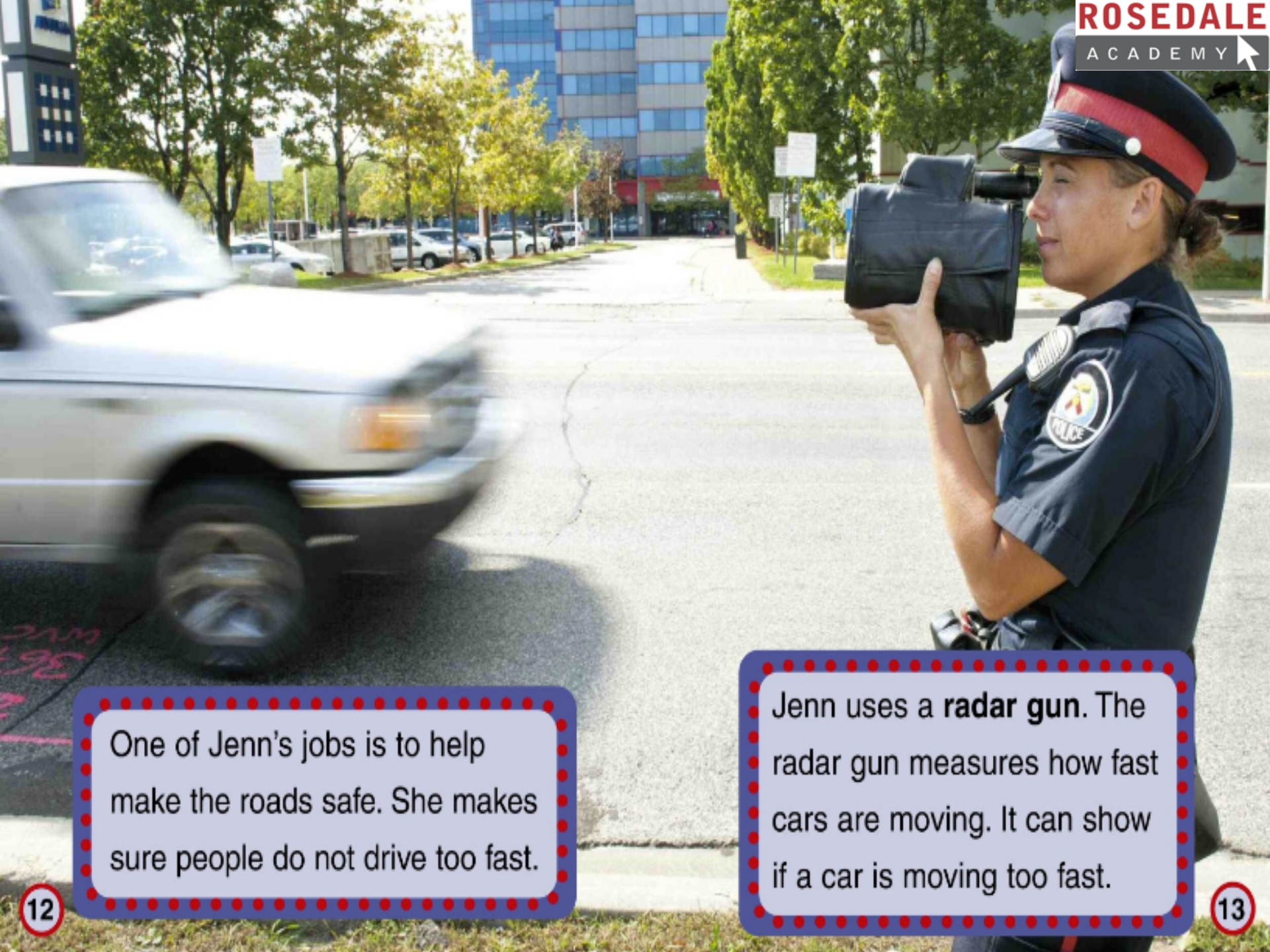


Jenn meets with her inspector and the superintendent. They tell her what duties, or jobs, she will do today.

to look up information.

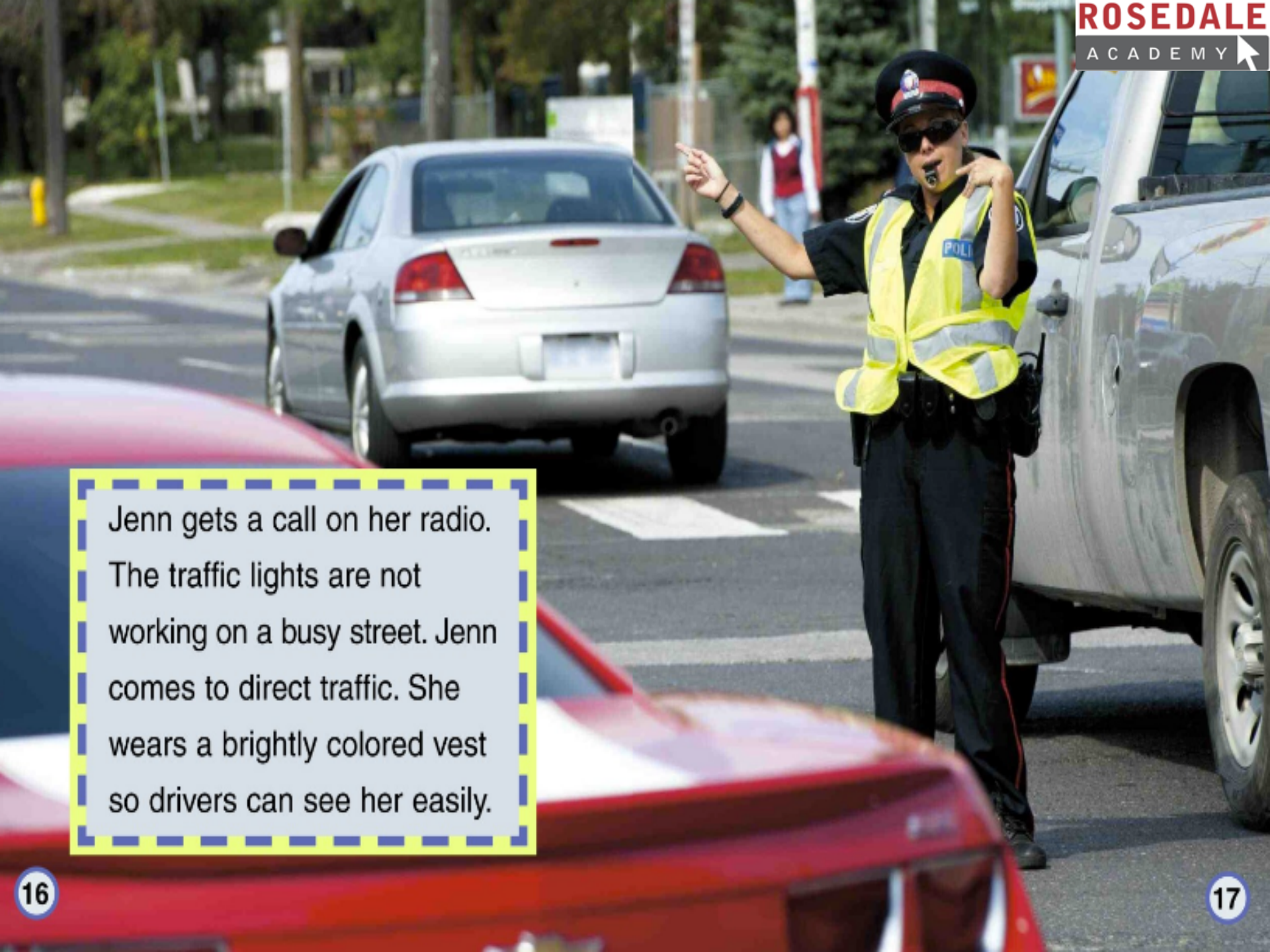


One of Jenn's jobs is to help make the roads safe. She makes sure people do not drive too fast.

Jenn uses a **radar gun**. The radar gun measures how fast cars are moving. It can show if a car is moving too fast.



Jenn gives this driver a **ticket** for driving too fast. She tells the driver to slow down and drive safely.



Jenn gets a call on her radio. The traffic lights are not working on a busy street. Jenn comes to direct traffic. She wears a brightly colored vest so drivers can see her easily.




Jenn gets another call on her radio. Someone is in trouble and needs help!

Put on your jacket!
It is cold outside!

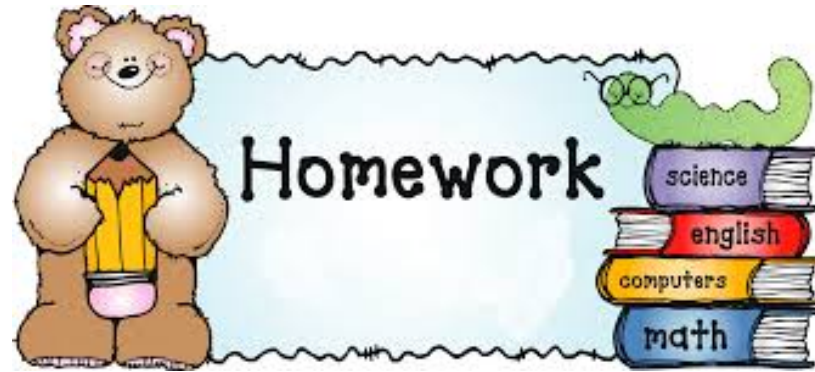
