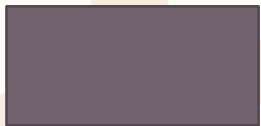

My family is a community

A **community** is a group of people who live together and care for one another.

There are eight people in my family.
Not all families are as big as mine.

Caring for one another

Communities look after people.

How we travel

Communities teach

Communities have schools,
but my family also teaches me.
My father is teaching me how to play chess.
My mother is teaching me how to paint.

My rules and jobs

Communities have **laws**, or rules.

I have to follow rules at home, too.

One of the rules is to do my jobs.

I do these jobs to help myself and others.

- Do something kind every day

Reflexive Pronouns

Reflexive pronouns are objects that refer to the subjects.

Reflexives end in – self or – selves

You are looking in a mirror.
You are looking at **yourself**.



Reflexive Pronouns - Myself, Yourself

they	themselves


